Please find below the information you asked for regarding the provisions in the use of glyphosate products in the Netherlands.

The state of play is:

- As from March 31st 2016 the use of pesticidal products other than for agricultural uses is forbidden by professional users on paved surfaces like gravel, stones, concrete, asphalt. This measure is meant to reduce risks to the aquatic environment as a result of surface run-off. By ministerial order there may be areas or circumstances where this rule does not apply.
- From November 1st 2017 <u>all uses</u> of pesticidal products 'outside agriculture' by <u>professional</u> users will be banned. Again here, by ministerial order areas or circumstances may be designated where this rule does not apply.
- For non-professional users so far no restrictions in use of PPPs were announced, although currently plans are being made to restrict these uses in the near future.
- Above rules implicate that there is no ban on glyphosate as such. The prohibitions apply to <u>specific uses</u> of <u>all</u> PPPs, including glyphosate.
